Seoul National University Student Exchange/Visiting Program Guideline for Fall 2019

Exchange Student Program

SNU Student Exchange Program is for students from SNU's partner universities who wish to study at SNU for one or two semesters and transfer credits to their home university program. The first official student exchange started in 1995 with the University of Tokyo, Japan, and for the last 30 years, the number of student exchange partners has increased to 240 institutions (university-wide) in the globe (as of December 2018). To study as an exchange student, candidates must be officially nominated to SNU by their home university and pay the tuition fee to home university.

Visiting Student Program

SNU Visiting Student Program is for students who are from SNU's non-partner universities but wish to study at SNU for one or two semesters. Students should pay the tuition fee directly to SNU and cannot apply for SNU on-campus housing. To apply for visiting student program, students must apply directly to Office of International Affairs (OIA), SNU, through the website (http://oia.snu.ac.kr).

Application Criteria & Process

1. Eligibility

- 1) Qualification
 - Candidates must be enrolled in at least second semester at home university program (= have completed at least one semester at the application stage)
 - * We cannot accept graduate students who are enrolled in the first semester of the Master's program at their application stage.
 - Candidates must have a GPA 3.0 or above / 4.0
 - Language proficiency of either English or Korean is highly recommended, but no certification is required.

- 2) Restriction (Newly added restrictions: red-colored)
- * Please note that applicants from the college/department-level partner universities can only choose the specific, partnered college/department. We strongly suggest that candidates must be advised of which college/department at SNU they are eligible for.
- College of Business Administration is restricted to students who are currently majoring in business or economics at their home institutions.

Considering the current lack of course capacity for exchange students, CBA has decided that from Fall 2019's admission, they will **strictly control the number of accepted exchange students to CBA** to provide quality education and better administrative support. In this regard, it is more likely than the past that students who apply for CBA **might get rejected** during the screening procedure.

- Applicants who apply for **Korean History/Psychology/Statistics/Pharmacy** department must provide proof of Korean language proficiency. A satisfactory level of Korean language ability should be Level 5 or above of the official Korean Language Proficiency Test, TOPIK.
- College of Law is NOT open to undergraduate level students from Spring 2018.
- * School of Law, a specialized law school for graduate level students, however, will be open to undergraduate level students from Fall 2018. Please note that these undergraduate students will be enrolled as graduate (Master's) students in SNU law school during their study.
- Applicants who want to study in the discipline of Pharmacy, Dentistry, Nursing, Music, and MBA must, in advance, be advised of their eligibility by SNU exchange program coordinators.
- College of Medicine is NO longer available to exchange students.
- School of Dentistry is open only to graduate students currently enrolled in a Master's program at School of Dentistry or the equivalent at home university.
- Vocal Music major is restricted to students who are currently studying vocal music at their home university.
- Graduate School of Business (MBA program) is restricted to current full-time MBA candidates at home university. Candidates must be aware that the academic system of MBA program differs from that of other programs (Details to be individually announced from the MBA coordinator). 3. Document Submission

- Important Notes: Exchange program candidates can complete the application by online submission of the required documents. However, visiting program candidates must complete both online and postal submission of the documents.
- All documents should be submitted in original or verified as an official copy (often stamped), and should be in Korean or in English. If the documents are not in Korean or in English, have them translated in Korean or in English and certified and sealed by an authorized body.
- Application documents are non-returnable once submitted to SNU.
- Please be aware that SNU cannot process applications if there is any missing document or information.

^{*}The sealed letter of recommendation must be obtained by the applicant and submitted to the exchange program coordinator. The coordinator can open the letter, scan it, and send it to the designated SNU coordinator via e-mail.



4. Screening Procedure

SNU OIA receives applications and reviews if all the application requirements have been met. The applications are then forwarded to the screening committee of each college/department for assessment. Not every candidate nominated will be successful; some may fail to be accepted if the requirements do not meet the committee's expectation. When the acceptance is confirmed, OIA will announce the results through students' home institution. Please note that SNU OIA is not responsible for the selection process and its results as the decisions are made by each college that candidates apply for.

5. Acceptance Package

The acceptance package encloses necessary documents for pre-arrival at SNU, including the Certificate of Admission (for non-Korean nationals), an official Letter of Acceptance, and other information. The package will be sent to the accepted candidates shortly after the acceptance announcement.

Academics & Students Life

1. Academic Calendar

For exchange students, SNU OIA will post an official academic transcript to home university by the end of July and by the end of January for each semester. Visiting students, however, must request for its issuance in person at SNU Division of Educational Affairs.

2. Courses

- Regular Curriclum: The majority of courses are taught in Korean but each college or department offers a number of courses in English as well. The course catalog for the new semester is available at the beginning of January or July each year. Undergraduate students can take courses up to 18 credits and graduate students can take up to 12 credits. More information: http://sugang.snu.ac.kr
- Korean Language Program: SNU Language Education Institute (LEI) offers Korean Language Programs (KLP) on a fee-paying, extracurricular basis. For exchange students taking KLP classes, however, SNU OIA will provide financial support to encourage international students to learn the Korean language and culture.

3. Housing

- On-Campus Housing: Gwanak Residence Halls, SNU's on-campus student dormitories on its main campus, have 18 residential buildings for both domestic and international students. Exchange students can apply for the dormitories, but please note that the room assignment is not guaranteed to every student. These dormitories are not available to visiting students. 4. Student Activities

- SNU Buddy Program

SNU Buddy was established in 2005 to help international exchange and visiting students and to build a real friendship by multilateral ways of communication. Students will do all the fun, student-oriented activities together with SNU domestic students during their semester. Sign-up notice will be sent through e-mail before the semester starts.

- Student Club

SNU offers a variety of student activities and sports clubs. Student clubs include musical bands, choir, orchestra, dance, painting, photography, student newspaper, traditional Korean music, travel clubs and SNU International Students Association. Sports clubs are available in fencing, golf, basketball, rugby, scuba-diving, snowboard, ski, horse riding, baseball, yacht, judo, kendo, soccer, taekwondo, tennis, etc.

6. Insurance & Health Care

Travel Insurance

It is mandatory for every exchange/visiting student to obtain a travel medical insurance that covers the entire period of their stay in Korea. Students should comply with the following guidelines:

- Students are required to have an insurance that is valid both in home country and in Korea.
- The insurance policy should cover at least sickness and accident during the stay in Korea.
- It is the responsibility of students that they are insured with an appropriate insurance. No additional assistance can be provided by SNU.

7. Visa

A student visa (D-2) is required for every non-Korean student who will be studying in Korea, and it must be acquired before entering Korea. In most cases, exchange/visiting students can acquire their D-2 visa easily when they present the Certificate of Admission (CoA) issued by SNU to the relevant officials in their home country. 1. HOW CAN I APPLY FOR THE STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM?

To apply for SNU student exchange program, your home university must first nominate you to SNU. Once nominated, SNU or your home university will provide you with the details about the application procedure. Please visit the following website to see more information.

2. WHY DO I HAVE TO CHOOSE A SPECIFIC COLLEGE AND DEPARTMENT DURING THE ONLINE APPLICATION PROCESS?

Once we receive all the application materials, we will forward them to the specific department that you have selected during the online application process. The department's screening committee will review your credentials on the basis of the submitted documents and will make a decision whether to accept you or not. Therefore, it is important for you to choose a college and department that most suits your academic background and study purpose.

Once accepted, you will be admitted to the college and department as a nondegree-seeking exchange student and can access modules and facilities with the same access with the one that domestic students have.

3. HOW CAN I APPLY FOR THE ON-CAMPUS DORMITORY? IS DORMITORY SPACE GUARANTEED?

Dormitory application guide will be provided to the students who are offered acceptance from SNU. While all exchange students can apply for the oncampus dormitory, *Gwanak Residence Halls*, the room assignment is not guaranteed due to lack of spaces. 4. HOW CAN I FIND AN OFF-CAMPUS HOUSING IN CASE I AM NOT ASSIGNED TO ON-CAMPUS DORMITORY?

You can request for information on off-campus housing to SNU OIA or ask your SNU buddy for help. While SNU will assist you in searching for housing, it is your own responsibility to obtain and maintain the off-campus housing contract.

5. HOW CAN I REGISTER FOR COURSES?

Course registration guide will be provided to the students who are offered acceptance from SNU. In general, course registration is scheduled at the end of July for Fall semester and at the end of January for Spring semester. Undergraduate students can take up to 18 credits, while graduates can take up to 12 credits.

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You can find the course list and syllabi on SNU course registration website. Please note that the final course catalog is updated online every July for Fall semester and January for Spring semester. Until then, you should refer to the catalogs of the previous semesters. http://sugang.snu.ac.kr

7. CAN I TAKE COURSES OUTSIDE OF MY DEPARTMENT?

Yes, you can take courses that are provided from other colleges and departments. However, please note that some courses have restrictions..

8. HOW CAN I OBTAIN ACADEMIC TRANSCRIPTS AT SNU?

SNU OIA will send one original copy of the transcript to your home university by the end of July and end of January for Fall and Spring semester.

9. IS THERE A KOREAN LANGUAGE PROGRAM AVAILABLE FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS?

Exchange Students can take Korean Language Programs provided by the SNU Language Education Institute, on a fee-paying basis. OIA will provide a full or partial financial support for the tuition fee for exchange students. To exchange students with Korean Studies major at home university, OIA offers a full tuition fee waiver. Please visit the following website to see the program information.

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All the non-Korean exchange students must apply for student visa (D-2) after receiving the acceptance packet from SNU. You have to visit your local Korean embassy/consulate with Certificate of Admission (CoA) which is to be enclosed in the packet along with other supporting documents. Please contact your nearest Korean Embassy/Consulate for more details on the visa application process.

11. CAN I STUDY IN KOREA WITH A TOURIST VISA?

No, it is illegal for you to participate in student exchange program with a tourist visa. You must obtain a student visa (D-2) before your arrival in Korea to study at SNU. If you have already obtained a different type of visa, you must check with the Korean Immigration Office in advance to confirm if your existing visa type is applicable for continuing the student exchange program. http://hikorea.go.kr

12. DO YOU HAVE A STUDENT GROUP WHICH HELPS EXCHANGE STUDENTS? HOW CAN I JOIN THE GROUP?

SNU runs *SNU Buddy*, a student group helping exchange students' settlement at SNU. SNU buddy organizes various events and activities throughout the semester. All exchange students offered acceptance will receive an invitation e-mail to join the SNU buddy before the beginning of the semester.

Nominated student(s) will receive an application guideline, along with instructions regarding the online application process, from the coordinators at SNU Office of International Affairs (central international office), SNU.

3. How to Apply?

The application deadline is March 20, 2019. Only the online application will be required for the application. Please make sure that your students carefully read through the attached guideline and prepare for the application process in advance.

*IMPORTANT NOTES FOR AY2019/20:

- Please make sure that applicant(s) have completed at least one semester on the current program at their application stage. This means that if the study abroad semester is applicant(s)' first semester of Master's program, they are not eligible for our program.
- Considering the current lack of course capacity for exchange students, CBA has decided that from Fall 2019's admission, they will strictly control the number of accepted exchange students to CBA to provide quality education and better administrative support. In this regard, we would like to inform you that it is more likely than the past that students who apply for CBA might get rejected during the screening procedure. (Applying to SNU's university-wide partners only)
- College of Medicine is no longer available to exchange students.
- College of Pharmacy newly require applicants to have Korean language proficiency, in addition to the Department of Korean History, Department of Psychology, and Department of Statistics.
- College of Law is NOT open to undergraduate students from Spring 2018, as the undergraduate level does not exist any longer. The School of Law, a specialized law school for graduate level students, will be open to undergraduate level students, instead. Please note that these undergraduate students will be enrolled as graduate (Master's) students in SNU law school during their study. These students must be advised that the credits they take at SNU should be transferred under their current undergraduate program, not their prospective graduate program.
- Priority for course registration for some of the Business Administration courses (See attachment, "College of Business Administration_Requisite Subject for Major") will be given to the regular degree-seeking students. Exchange students may take the course only when there are extra spots available. As the courses are mandatory courses for degree-seeking students, generally, all seats are quickly filled up. Please advise your nominee(s) of this issue and make sure that they plan ahead, and have a Plan B.
- When there are applicant(s) for Pharmacy/Dentistry/Nursing/Music /Global MBA, please let us know before the nomination as these are relatively restricted ones than the other majors. We will check with the department of their eligibility.
