#### Recent Units taught

- International business special project (IBUS3106: International business special project Undergraduate program): provides students across faculties the opportunities to study social entrepreneurship in Vietnam as part of an action research project. Students are tasked with reviewing local markets, researching best practice internationally and locally, and adapting solutions to fit with the unique Vietnamese business environment and contexts. Students research projects aim to provide strategic recommendations that enable Vietnamese social enterprises to enhance their operations and social impact.
- Strategy, Innovation and Entrepreneurship (IBUS5002– Postgraduate program): provides students opportunities to understand the complexity of the innovation process and learn how to navigate different business environments to maximise value from innovation. Theories and frameworks are further tested in the real-life business projects offered by participating companies. Key activities in tutorials include: (i) work on real company projects (start-up companies in Australia), and (ii) analysis and discussion of case studies of local and global companies.
- MIBS6005 International Business Project A (Postgraduate program): Mandatory capstone unit for Master of International Business. This unit aims to prepare students for global careers and to develop and improve their professional practice in cross-border and cross-cultural settings. It provides the opportunity to undertake advanced training in the areas of research methodology, professional communication in its many forms, teamwork, analytical skills, project management and consulting.
- **MIBS6006 International Business Project B** (Postgraduate program): Mandatory capstone unit for Master of International Business. This unit is completed at the end of the Master of International Business program. It enables students to apply the knowledge, theories and skills which they have developed throughout the program. Students engage in an international

consulting project for participating companies. The project requires students to define, analyse and propose solutions to actual problems related to the relevant international dimensions of the participating company's operations.

- Cross Cultural Management (IBUS6002 Master Program & IBUS1102 Undergraduate Program): These two units provide students opportunities to learn conceptual frameworks and evidence from practice to develop an understanding of cross-cultural management in the international business context. Teaching in tutorials on these units focus on case discussions, role play exercises on cross cultural management practices.
- Strategic Management (WORK2210 Undergraduate Program): This unit explores how strategy is formulated, implemented and evaluated. Strategic management concepts, frameworks and tools are applied to organizational case studies. Current debates in strategic management are evaluated for their relevance to strategists in a range of organizational contexts.
- Succeeding in Business (BUSS6000 Postgraduate Program): This program-wide capstone unit is compulsory for students in their final semester of study within the Master of Commerce program. Students work collaboratively with peers and advisors to integrate the discipline-specific knowledge acquired within their program to address practical business challenges requiring cross-disciplinary and cross-functional insights, knowledge and skills. Assessment is designed to assure student proficiency in program learning goals. Students work in self-managing cross-functional teams to complete a semester-long project, preparing individual and group reports that are assessed by academic staff. Weekly seminars include action learning in the business life cycle, data analysis, strategic decision-making, change management, business communication, and ethical awareness and reasoning in business practice. Learning activities include short case studies and business case simulation.
- **Global Business** (IBUS5003 Postgraduate Program): This unit provides a foundation of the key concepts and practices of international business. Students gain knowledge on the factors that impact international managerial strategy. Through discussions of authoritative literature, case studies, and current issues, students learn to assess the opportunities and challenges of operating in a global environment. The unit emphasizes the development of analytical skills and competency of working in diverse teams and the global context.
