Many major banks, hotels, restaurants, etc. accept credit cards, but the majority of local retailers, restaurants, etc. do not accept credit cards. Verify that your contract between you and your credit card company allows you to use your card in Japan before coming.

Level of English Proficiency	Applicants whose first language is NOT English are required to achieve a standard of TOEFL score 500 (PBT) or its equivalent, or IELTS score of 5.0 or equivalent.
